MINISTER'S MUSINGS



Greetings members and friends of Faith UCC!

The summer has been an unusually filled one, and so many positive things are happening in our church and the United Church of Christ. Having attended or Northern Association, Penn Central Conference, and General Synod, there is much to be excited about how our denomination is leading in ways to address societal issues and to take a progressive stand for the values to which our Christian heritage proclaims. These are challenging times, but our faith is up to the challenge with the grace of God!

Heart and Soul Gatherings, sessions in which we tell of our personal journeys that have been pivotal in forming our spirits and/or values, will continue as they had through the summer. These have been meaningful for those who have participated already. If you have not attended one of these, please sign up soon to do so in order for us to prepare for other aspects of the interim process. We need EVERYONE'S participation in these sessions, and throughout this important interim time as we learn more about who we are so we can better discern where God is leading us to go and be.

As we welcome back both students and those who have been away for much of the summer, we are thankful for the vitality of our congregation and those who are engaged in our various forms of ministry. We will be having a "Rally Day" on September 10th to kick off a new season of educational and other ministries at Faith UCC. This celebrative worship service will affirm many of our ministries, but especially the educational ministries and our commitment to nurture the Religious Education of all ages in our church. We'll recognize those who have offered to teach and help in these ministries, and also show thankfulness for all our students, young and old, who participate in our offerings designed to foster their spiritual growth.

On Wednesdays, September 13th and 20th, at 6:30-8:00 p.m., I will be holding a class designed help us to learn about our UCC history which will provide an introduction to those who would like to become members of the church, as well as to further edify our current membership on our historic past and inspired future. These will also be an opportunity to get to know one another better, helping us to make new and/or deeper relationships, and to see the diversity of people that our church has, and continues, to attract.

On Sunday, September 24th, we will have our worship service outside on the lawn (weather permitting, otherwise in the basement) in order to accommodate the other creatures in our families, our pets, in worship with us! We'll have a "Blessing of the Animals" ritual included in our worship which is not only fun and delightful, but also meaningful and memorable. So bring your pets, on leashes or otherwise constrained, and join in this opportunity to have our pets meet our wider spiritual family and we them! BTW, if anyone plays guitar or other instruments that we could use outside and would be willing to play, please contact me!





We will also be enlisting soon those who have the talents and aptitudes for serving on the Church Profile Team and also on the Church Pastoral Search Team, some of whom may be on both. We are especially in need of a diverse representation of our congregation each of whom can listen, respect, and communicate in positive ways with a variety of people and also analyze, assess, and present information to the congregation with regard to our ways of communicating and acting as a church. These teams will need to consider the successes and challenges we have had as a congregation in the past, and how we may need to heal, grow, and flourish into our future. They will also address how our congregation has organized itself to do its ministry, the means and methods by which

we communicate and work together, and then help facilitate discussion on how we can learn from our past and strive to better ourselves into the future.

A Behavioral Covenanting process may be recommended for us to set a healthy standard for relating to one another in all aspects of our church life – a process than can not only help us keep appropriate boundaries, but which may help attract more of our members to participate in our ministry teams because of our intentional way of affirming these boundaries. The Teams will also need to study and recommend UCC identity designations such as Green Church/Whole Earth, JustPeace, and Sanctuary Church that, along with Open and Affirming (ONA) which we've already established, may clarify our vision and mission, as well as attract the appropriate ministerial candidates who would be an excellent fit for our congregation. These are all instrumental parts of the envisioning process, and will help us to later create the most accurate vision and mission statements for which our church will commit itself in the years to come, which themselves will be necessary before we begin filling out our church's profile that will be perused by ministerial candidates.

On October 1st, we will have World Communion Sunday – and you'll definitely want to attend! We'll have breads and juices from around the world as we reflect upon the worldwide Body of Christ. It is a favorite service of many. If you would like to bake some breads from around the world for use in this service, or bring juices from the various continents, we invite you to contribute to make this a special and inspiring service!

We will need a new Out of the Cold Coordinator. The job description is:

- Represent Faith UCC on the OOTC board of directors (voting member)
- Attend monthly board of directors meetings (3rd Monday of each month). Meetings typically last from 1-2 hours.
- Serve on OOTC task forces / committees as necessary to help the OOTC program. This is optional.
- Recruit, coordinate, & train volunteers that will serve for the 2 week period when it is hosted at Faith UCC. This activity starts about 2-3 months prior to schedule hosting period.
- Coordinate equipment drop-off / pick-up and other logistics when OOTC is hosted at Faith UCC. This is during the hosting period.
- Primary person that is responsible & accountable during the hosting period of 2 weeks.
- All training material and other necessary resources are provided by the OOTC board

If this sounds like something you want to be involved in, please contact any member of Consistory. It is certainly a job that can be shared between two people.

October 7th the Northern Association of the Penn Central Conference (of which we are a member church) is having their fall meeting. If you would like to go to represent Faith UCC, please speak to Pastor Bret or any member of Consistory. It is a small but enthusiastic group of folks.

Our Annual Meeting will be held on Sunday, December 17th following worship. Consistory will provide a light lunch prior to the meeting. We need a Nominating Committee to find willing and eager folks to fill upcoming positions on both Consistory and the Ministry Teams. Again, if this is a short-term volunteer opportunity that speaks to you feel free to speak to any member of Consistory.

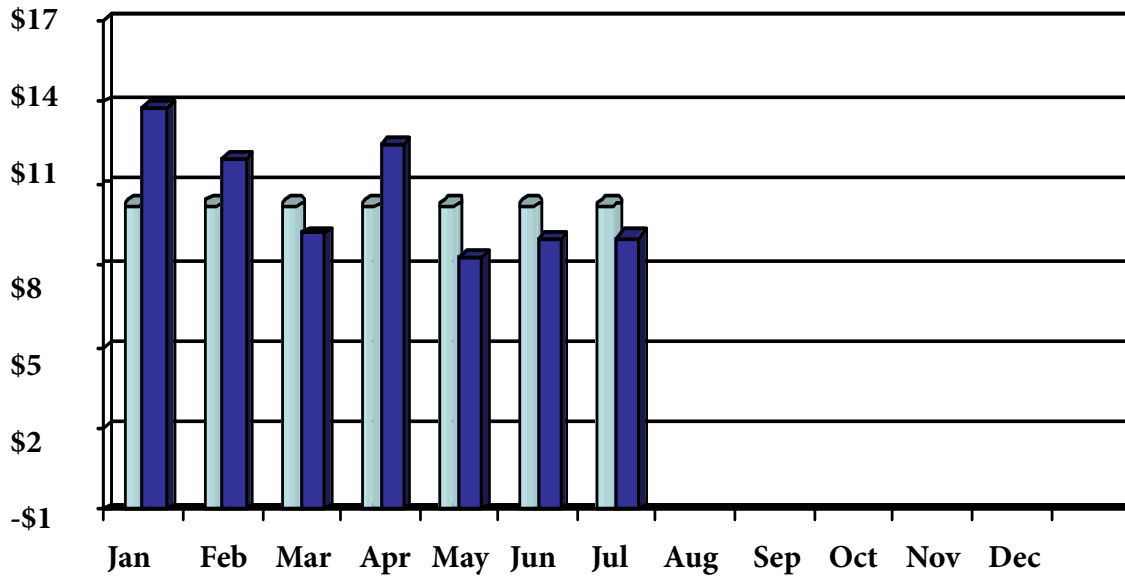

Knitting 4 Peace is part of an International organization known as Women 4 Women/Knitting 4 Peace, Denver, CO.

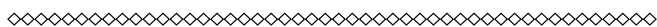
Our Peace Pod knitters are Jean Frank, Sue Doran, Susan Brandse, Jean Weller, Sally Welsh, and Jane Childs.

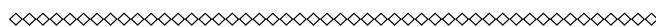


“Faith UCC is a welcoming church open to all and very strong in its fellowship. Together we have been able to do some pretty incredible things for the community!

What is Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation?

Alex's Lemonade Stand Foundation (ALSF) was formed because of a girl named Alex Scott. At a very young age, Alex was diagnosed with neuroblastoma, a type a cancer. Upon seeing all the other sick kids around her at the doc-

tor's offices and hospitals, she decided to start a lemonade stand to raise money for cancer research. The stand was a huge success, and soon, that one stand turned into many, as she inspired others to raise money too. At the age of 8, Alex lost the physical battle she had been fighting, but lives on in the hearts of so many. Her family continues raising money, holding lemonade stands, and encouraging others to get involved in ALSF.

Why am I Involved with ALSF?

Hi, my name is Emily Reiss and a few years ago I was lucky enough to be 1 of 60 teens who attended Alex's Lemonade Stand Leadership Academy held at Villanova University. During that time, many speakers came and held presentations, my favorite being Alex's parents who touched the hearts of each and every one of us. Together we laughed, and cried, and bonded beyond belief. I came home a different person with a better perspective, and the desire to stay involved in this incredible foundation.

What's Alex's Million Mile?

Alex's Million Mile is an event created by ALSF in order to help spread cancer awareness in a way that promotes the health of all. September is childhood cancer awareness month, and over the course of those 30 days people from all over the WORLD form teams, and track the number of miles that they walk, run, or bicycle. Collectively, by September 30th, we all try to reach a total of 1,000,000 miles!



How can one join a team?

My team is called "The Crazy Lemons." You may join me at any time during the month of September using the link www.alexslimonade.org/mypage/1337861 . On that page, click "Join the team!" on the lower right side. You will then be directed to create an account. Keep your username and password handy, so that you can sign in later to track your miles. You will also be asked to set a mileage and fundraising goal. Fundraising is appreciated but not necessary to be a part of the team. At the end of the day it's all about walking, running, or cycling, with this amazing little girl in our hearts. Additionally, there are a few apps listed on the website that you may also track your miles with. No computer? I can add you as a member manually and input your miles as you tell me them. Your pet's miles count too!

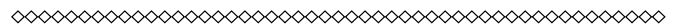
PACCT:

Parents of Addicted Children Coming Together is a new program being offered by Community Help Centre providing education and support to parents struggling with the substance abuse of a grown child.

It is a 4 week course that incorporates group discussion and opportunities for participants to interact, with an emphasis on self-care and personal well-being.

Topics include: substance abuse, addition, recovery, and relapse; impacts on the family; healthy behaviors and coping skills; how to reduce enabling behaviors; how to encourage sobriety in the home; and treatment options and local resource information.
