#### **Resurrection Hope**

I have seen the Lord! - Mary Magdalene

"I have seen the Lord!" That was the first sermon preached about the resurrection. Jesus chose to reveal his resurrected self to Mary first, and he called her to go tell the disciples." It was a short and succinct sermon (shorter than ones I have preached!), and the beauty of it is that Mary spoke from her heart after her encounter with resurrection. Resurrection changes our hearts and moves us to tell others about our experience.

Think about the friend you have that has now been cancer free for a couple of years. New life has been given to them, and it is a literal resurrection of a second chance at life. Every day begins with gratitude, as the gift of living in this very moment is a miracle! Or maybe you, or someone you know, has gone through a divorce. After the heartache and the questioning if you would ever find love again, you begin to watch the heart resiliently come alive and open to the love and being cared for once again. Resurrection! There it is again. Resurrection happens everyday, and like Mary peering into the empty tomb, we are the storytellers of the new life made possible through the strength of

God's presence in our life.

This month we will enter into the story of the promise of the hope of resurrection and the mystery of eternal glory. We will journey with Christ as palm branches wave around us, and we will break bread at the table where we are all invited to dine; it is the table where we learn just how loved we are by Christ and where we learn to love each other. We will hear the story of the betrayal of our Lord, by one of his closet friend. And we will weep as we remember the crucifixion and ponder anew what that day means for us. And finally, just like in our own lives when we think we can't go on anymore, a new hope is given to us in the empty tomb. Resurrection!

Resurrection is still happening. That is God's specialty, making old things new, restoring our hope, and granting us joy after our mourning. We wake up to find we've been given a new opportunity to start over. Resurrection!

I invite you to join me in the practice of resurrection on earth as it is in heaven. Look for signs of God's new life in our church. Look for signs of God's grace in your own heart. Look for ways God is making all things new! We will do that on Easter morning in the joy of our sanctuary. We will proclaim "Hallelujah! Life is stronger than death!" and we will remind each other of the promise of resurrection.



Then on April 28th at 3:00 PM we will practice another type of resurrection as I am installed, officially, as your new Pastor. We will celebrate God's faithfulness, and we will dream anew as we commit to being a resurrection people of God's love and joy together.

Bring a friend, or two, as we pray and practice the resurrection together. We're all needed in this revolutionary love of God's light and hope among us. Each one of us have stories to tell, like Mary Magdalene, about seeing the Lord anew. We need to share them with each other and with our world that is in need of hope.

I look forward to hearing your stories and sharing some of mind in the coming months. Resurrection hope is for each one of us!



This is a difficult topic for an Open Christian Church but we are addressing the situation as best we


know how! Please keep us all in your prayers.

#### "Thank you!"

Those words were said sincerely to us many times during the two weeks we hosted the Out of the Cold evening guests. They were addressed to all of us for offering a place that was warm and hospitable (though not comfortable). This was a larger group of homeless people than in previous years and one-quarter of them had jobs (one gentleman came in at 2:30 a.m. from work).



The thanks goes to many—those who brought or contributed food, those who served as hosts/hostesses or helped with the meals, those brave souls who stayed and slept on cots overnight, those who helped set up and break down the sleeping areas, those who made (and continue to make through our offerings) cash donations, and those who support in many other ways. In addition, with the Women's Guild buying the necessary paper products, and your contributions, dinner and breakfast expenses were covered.

Some of our guests also are here during the three days that we offer a few hours of respite\* some asleep on our tile floor. A note--since these people do not have a noontime meal on the weekends, the OOC representative who was here in the evenings asked if we could leave extra nutrition bars on Saturday and Sunday morning so those with no money could have something to eat between breakfast and dinner at 9:00 in the evening. Thanks too for helping in that way.

We ask one more thing---as you thank God for your blessings (one of those a warm home), please remember those who are much less fortunate in your prayers.
