Happy New Year, Faith UCC friends and members!

I am grateful to God to finally be with you as your Pastor and fellow sojourner of the Spirit. My wife and I have moved to the area and are slowly beginning to make a new home in this wonderful place we call Happy Valley. I have traded towering concrete buildings for majestic mountains, and I do believe this is an upgrade! It is good to be with you all. I am looking forward to getting to know you more very soon as we work together to follow God's leading in the ministry that God has entrusted to us.

The liturgical year begins with holy curiosity. January 6th commences the season of Epiphany. Epiphany $(\theta \epsilon o \phi \acute{\alpha} v \epsilon i \alpha)$ means an appearance, a manifestation, or a glorious display. It's the moment when we think "Ah, ha! I have never seen it that way!" Epiphanies awaken our souls to the profundity of the mysteries of the universe.

My first Sunday with you we will read the story about inquisitive sojourners and their caravans from far away lands who made a long journey to visit the newborn Christ Child. These pilgrims of the desert had an epiphany of their own. The Gospel of Matthew recounts it this way:

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. – Matthew 2:9-11

These curious stargazers believed that the cosmos spoke of the wonders of God. Indeed, the Holy Spirit spoke to these magi as they faithfully began a journey to explore the questions they had. Did they know whom they were about to visit? Were they scared? Excited? I imagine many of the questions we have in our spiritual journeys they also had.

At the very beginning of the Christian story, God weaves interfaith friends together in holy curiosity. God is always drawing new people together and making the table of our Lord bigger so that each person has a seat at the feast of grace. As we contemplate this story this month and curiously get to know each other more, my prayers are with us as we wonder who might need a church home like ours. How is God calling us to reach out to our community in new ways? What do our individual souls need to awaken to the mysteries of God more profoundly? I wonder what epiphanies God will reveal to us this year.



As we begin to get to know each other and build our relationship as Pastor and congregation, let us, friends in Christ, be like the magi setting out on a journey of curiosity, asking these questions: How will God use us together in the ministry of grace? In what ways is God calling us to continue the compassionate courageous ministry of Faith? What new ministry are we called to?

My soul comes alive pondering these questions with you, so during the month of January, I have set up times to meet with you over coffee/tea both in the church and at local coffee shops. I am calling these Listening Cafés. You will quickly learn that I like good coffee and good tea. I believe these hot cups bring people together. I desire to get to know you, listen to you, and facilitate chances for us to get to hear each other and God in our midst. Please stop by at one of these times and introduce yourself for an informal chance to fellowship together!






